How is high school different?

Activities


Traditional and non-traditional sports (i.e. archery, outdoor games and kickboxing)

Same in all 3 courses



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



Alternate Course

Special Programs Start in Grade 11

Specialist High Skills Majors (We have five)

- Students will graduate with specialized skills, knowledge and certifications relevant to their chosen industry
- Students take a 2-credit co-op and a bundle of 5 credits in addition to English and Math
- No special preparation is needed in grade 9 or 10

The five majors are:

 Arts & Culture, Health & Wellness, Hospitality & Tourism, Information & Communication Technology, and Manufacturing

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International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

- A challenging two-year curriculum (Gr 11 & 12)
- Includes studying six subjects
- Provides a global perspective with cross-cultural understanding
- Leads to a qualification recognized by the world's universities
- Students graduate with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma AND the IB Diploma
