Needs

- Students who are struggling with self-regulation, confidence in their ability to learn and positive self-esteem (survey data, staff observations, student conversations)
- There is a need to create a sense of community with classrooms, the school and the GLA community. (Survey data)

Vision / How we will get there

- If we create a Staff Planning Team (Culture Club) then we can create a vision of what makes GLA a great place to learn.
- If we create common language regarding what makes GLA great, then we can use this language from K-8 when dealing with conflicts, self-regulation and behavior norms and expectations.

Strategies
