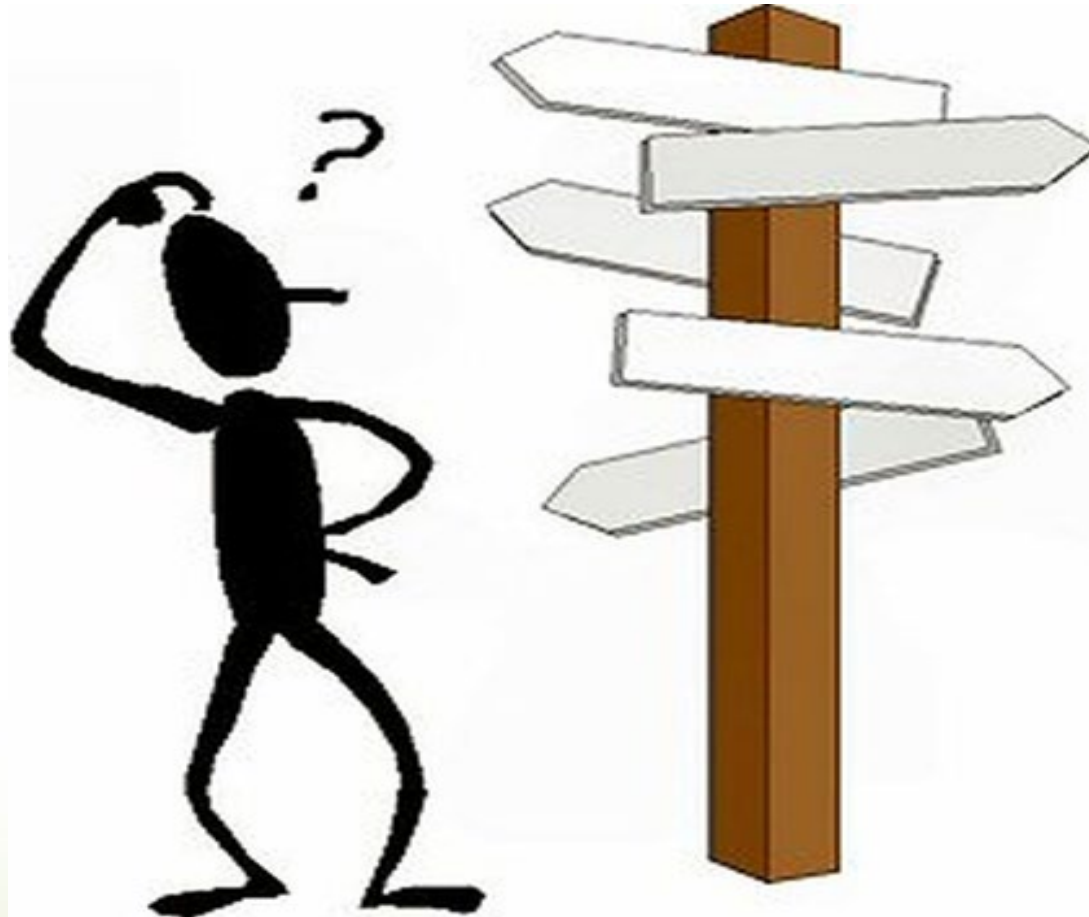
WHAT IS A PATHWAY?
